Arabica coffee was introduced to Uganda in the 1900s from neighboring Malawi. High-quality arabica thrives in small farms that dot the foothills of Mt. Elgon in Rwenzori Mountains—known as the Mountains of the Moon. Coffee is grown in lush green hills in small plots nurtured by rich volcanic soil, and adequate rainfall. Ugandan coffee farmers are supported by the Starbucks Farmer Support Center (FSC) in Rwanda. In addition to facilitating training and resources for Rwandan farmers, our agronomists and quality specialists provide open-source support to coffee farmers in Uganda, Burundi, D.R. Congo, Zambia, and Kenya.
