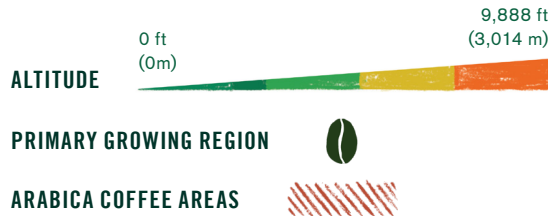


BALI



The island of Bali is located east of Java in the Indonesian archipelago. Most coffee grown in Bali comes from the Kintamani region on the northeast side of the island. Coffee in Bali is produced mainly by smallholder farmers who intercrop with orange trees, chilis, and root plants like taro, potatoes, and cassava which provides additional income to their families. Here the combination of high elevation, rich fertile volcanic soil, and the ecosystem gives the coffee its complexity and sweetness we love.

Coffee farmers in Bali are supported by the Starbucks Farmer Support Center (FSC) in Sumatra. Our agronomists focus on facilitating training and sharing best practices to help increase the volume of coffee cherries and provide tools for younger generations to stay in coffee farming.
