



Uganda is a country of diverse landscapes and abundant wildlife near the center of the African continent, where it borders Lake Victoria. It is also home to a small-but-growing coffee industry, where the bean can be grown in lush green hills nurtured by rich volcanic soil and sufficient rainfall.

Coffee farming as a practice came comparatively late here, starting in the 1900s. Today, the smallholder coffee farms of Uganda average less than one acre in size – just 600 trees typically. These coffee farmers are supported by the Starbucks Farmer Support Center (FSC) in Rwanda. Our agronomists and quality specialists provide open-source support with a focus on increasing their productivity and helping them plant disease-resistant coffee varieties.
