PRIMARY ARABICA COFFEE AREAS 

European traders first introduced coffee to Honduras in the 1700s. Today, the country is the largest coffee producer in Central America, and one of the largest producers in the world. A combination of international demand, government support and ideal growing conditions – environment, elevation and soil – have fueled the growth of the industry here.

Although conditions are ideal, climate change does pose a threat. This is especially true during harvesting and processing. Dry weather is critical during these times, but local rainfall patterns are becoming less predictable. Starbucks Farmer Support Centers (FSCs) in Central America provide education and training to coffee farmers in Honduras to help them meet the challenges they face. The goal is a more sustainable future – for the farmers, and for everyone who loves the coffee they grow.
