PRIMARY ARABICA COFFEE AREAS

Indonesia is an important coffee-producing country, and its history starts on the island whose name became synonymous with the drink itself. Java is both the nation's most populous island and the first place coffee was grown here, starting in the 1600s. Today, neighboring Sumatra produces most of Indonesia's coffee, but it's still an important crop on Java, where it thrives in the lush, volcanic soil. Javanese coffee farmers often grow coffee trees alongside beans, avocados, and timber. The intercropping is an agricultural practice that helps all plants flourish and provides extra income.

Coffee farmers on Java and elsewhere in Indonesia are supported by the Starbucks Farmer Support Center (FSC) on Sumatra. Our agronomists and quality specialists provide open-source support facilitating and training farmers about best practices that impact coffee quality.
